In our previous newsletter we invited those of you interested in becoming part of the executive to put your names forward. We are delighted to welcome two new members onto the Board, Rosie Belton and Nadja Grabner-Thornley.

Rosie's association with the Arts Centre spans 40 years, first as a university student and then as a tenant for her businesses, the Creative Drama Centre and later the Christchurch Drama Centre and ActNow Casting Agency. With class/rehearsal /office space in first, the Peterborough Centre, and then the Cranmer Centre, both at the time under the Arts Centre umbrella, and performance and workshop space in the Arts Centre Great Hall and Function centre rooms the Arts Centre was home to many rich years of drama related activities. She was a residential tenant for 6 months and then completed her last years as an office space tenant in the Chemistry Block leaving finally in 2009 just before the first of the earthquakes. Rosie is now very happy to be back in a new role, looking to help protect the future use of these wonderful buildings.

Nadja's association with the Arts Centre dates back to her earliest days and spans her whole life having grown up living in the apartments, with her parents being residents for over 30 years up until the earthquakes. At one time they all worked in the Arts Centre, with her father David Thornley having his office there, her mother Doris Grabner having her florist shop in the old boiler house, and Nadja working at Annie's Wine Bar and Restaurant during her high school and early university years. She feels very privileged to have joined the Friends of the Arts Centre executive committee, with her late father having been a previous member and part of the formation of the Friends. To her the Art Centre is the most wonderful place — a collection of beautiful buildings, many memories, a place truly for the people of Christchurch, and above all it will always be home.

Difficult financial times

You will all be aware of the serious financial difficulties confronting the Arts Centre caused by a loss of Council funding and exacerbated by the Covid-19 lockdown. A successful give-a-little campaign was run, which helped, but unfortunately, not enough to stave off loss of jobs. The role of Friends is even more important at this time. Please remember to renew your subscription if you have not already done so. You will have received a 2020 Friends card if your subscription is up to date.

The Friends not only carry out fundraising events but we also apply for grants. We were recently successful in obtaining a Te Papa Helping Hands Grant to assist with the cost of purchasing an Evac chair. This is intended to be used to allow evacuation from the Rutherford's Den lecture theatre in the event of a medical emergency where a stretcher would normally be used. It is not possible to get a stretcher up the stairs. The chair will also allow a means of access to the venue for those with impaired mobility.
