In our previous newsletter we referred to the financial plight of the Arts Centre. On the 22nd of October Christchurch City Council voted to grant the Arts Centre a one -off sum of \$150,000 to enable it to keep the doors open. This is a significant help but will not solve the Arts Centre's long term problems. It is still vital that the Council agrees to reinstate annual funding in its upcoming review of the long-term plan. When public consultation takes place on the review, you can help by making a submission supporting regular funding for the Arts Centre.

On the 10th of September we held our fundraising Quiz night. The evening was a great success, thoroughly enjoyed by all who participated. The ability to purchase clues and answers added a novel element to the event and everyone entered fully into the fundraising spirit by purchasing lots of them! Despite having to reduce the numbers attending because of uncertainty over Covid, we raised a total of \$4580.46. The executive committee handed over a cheque to Chief Executive, Philip Aldridge at our October meeting.

We are planning a repeat of the Quiz Night in late March or early April next year.

WHAT'S ON

Sculpture Festival: 13-27 November 10am - 5pm

This festival features works by local artists selected by the well-known founder of Form Gallery, Koji Miyazaki, on display in the North as well as the Great Hall. Over 30 artists will be exhibiting works with 300 works available for sale, including ceramics and jewellery. Both the Arts Centre and the artists will benefit from any sales. In addition to the works exhibited in the Great Hall and in the North Quad, there will be a ceramics exhibition, **Miscellany**, in Pūmanawa (upstairs in Old Boys High) and a harakeke installation, **Permeable**, in the South Quad. There will also be a dance performance associated with the harakeke installation between 4-4.30 over the weekend of the festival (tickets required).



The festival may be visited free of charge during the week but tickets are required at the weekend (including Show Day - 13th of November. The weekends will include live music, artists talks, demonstrations, hands-on workshops and food and drink stalls. Full details about the talks and demonstrations can be found on the Arts Centre Website and tickets can be booked there. Entry is \$15 for adults, \$5 for children, with children under 12

free. However please note that there is an additional charge for workshops and numbers are limited.
