
Memorial Window

The progress on the restoration of the Great Hall is going well, with the latest addition being central heating. The Memorial Window was re-installed at the end of November, ready to hold a re-dedication service in mid-December. The work on the restoration of the Great Hall and the Memorial Window has been possible, thanks to the Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trust (The Aotearoa Foundation, Fletcher Building and the Ministry for Culture and Heritage), the Mainland Foundation and The Southern Trust.

The memorial stained glass window commemorates the staff and students from the University of Canterbury who fought in the First World War. Over 400 staff and students served throughout the war, of whom 98 were killed and over 20% wounded.

The artist was an Englishman, Martin Travers, and the whole window is in the shape of Britain.

The image (from the top) depicts the mother of humanity, with her babies who represent future generations. Famous historical people are standing on an island of civilization. around this is the sea of chaos, the Roman numerals date the war (1914 - 1918)



and the mass of famous historical figures represent Truth, Justice, Courage and Humanity.

The ship on the left of the image is HMS Resolution, which Captain James Cook commanded. At the bottom New Zealand soldiers can be seen fighting hydra monsters which represent Brutality and Ignorance.

Stonemason display draws crowds



More than 100 people flocked to the Arts Centre stonemasons' tent last month when it opened its doors to the public as part of Beca Heritage Week.

Three of the site's 15 stonemasons were on hand to answer questions and give stone carving tips to visitors as they had a go for themselves.

Stonemasonry is one of the most labour-intensive tasks on-site and this year alone the stonemasons will carve about 200,000kg of limestone – that's the equivalent weight of a Blue Whale.

When the restoration project is complete, the buildings will feature many of their original features and this simply would not be possible without the skill of the stonemasons. Some carvings will replace those destroyed by the earthquakes, while others are features that have not been on the buildings for decades.





The Clock Tower restoration nears completion

The Clock Tower was Canterbury College's first stone building, designed as a tribute to the Christian Oxbridge tradition. Built of Port Hills' basalt and Oamaru limestone, the 214 kg clock, installed in 1878, has been repaired and is running true to time.

An engineer from the original clock supplier in London, Gillett and Johnston, was sent to overhaul the mechanism after it was stuck at 12.51 on February 22 in 2011.

The landscaping around the Clock Tower is now underway, with plans to restore the gardens to plantings true to the original plans.
